# PLAINTIFF'S UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF DISCOVERY DEADLINES

Plaintiff Securities and Exchange Commission ("Commission") respectfully requests that the Court grant an extension of time of the discovery deadlines as set forth below. In support thereof, the Commission states as follows:

1. Pursuant to this Court's Case and Management Report (D.E. 175) and the Court's Order Granting Extension to Disclose Experts (D.E. 293) the disclosure of Experts' Reports should occur by June 14, 2021 for Plaintiff and July 14, 2021 for Defendants. In addition, the deadline for completion of non-expert discovery is currently July 2, 2021 and the deadline to file dispositive and *Daubert* motions is August 2, 2021. The Commission requests an extension of those dates so that, if granted, the new due dates would be:

a.	Non-expert discovery deadline	9/3/2021
b.	Plaintiff's expert's disclosure	9/14/2021
c.	Defendants' expert disclosures	9/30/2021

### d. Dispositive and *Daubert* Motions 11/1/2021

2. Good cause exists for this motion because both parties are still gathering discovery and information that will be needed by the experts before they can complete their reports. In addition, a mediation in this matter has been set before Magistrate Judge Porcelli, for June 28, 2021. If this mediation is successful, the need for further discovery and experts will be alleviated. Moreover, the Commission and Defendant Davison have a settlement in principal to amicably resolve all issues between them and the case has been stayed until August 23, 2021 as to Davison. Allowing this limited extension will not prejudice any party to this proceeding and will preserve resources for all parties.

3. Nor will such an extension delay the proceedings in this case as this matter is not set until the March 2022 trial term. Thus, even with the extension, the Court will still have five months to consider any dispositive motions as well as any *Daubert* motions that may be filed.

## Local Rule 3.01(g) Certification

4. Pursuant to Local Rule 3.01(g) undersigned counsel for the Commission have conferred with counsel for Defendant Rybicki who do not oppose the relief requested in this motion.

WHEREFORE, for the foregoing reasons, the Commission respectfully requests that this Court enter an Order granting an extension of time of the discovery deadlines as set for the above.
